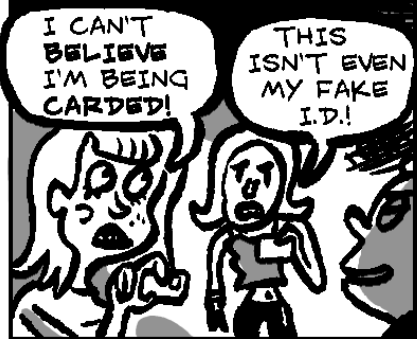


**VOTER

Angela H., Allyson M., and who knows how many other college students had their votes denied because their student I.D.'s didn't show their dorm room addresses...

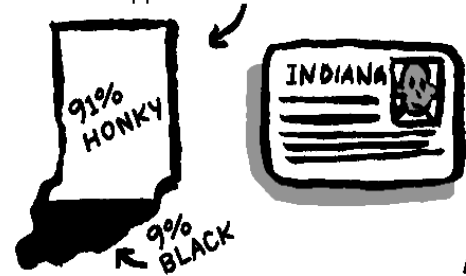


What the **HELL** is going on? Nothing, says secretary of state Todd Rokita:

So Palast crunched the numbers: African-Americans make up 9% of Indiana's electorate (that comes to approx. 400,000 voters).

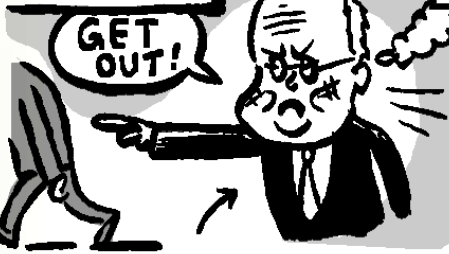


According to a Univ. of Washington study, 28% of those don't carry the I.D. that's required.



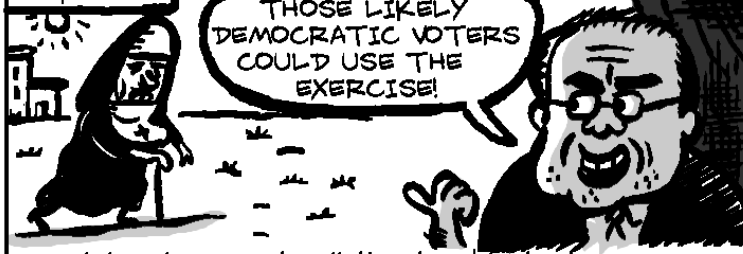
